Minutes of the 44th Annual General Meeting of the Harvard Club of Australia

Minutes of the Forty-fourth Annual General Meeting held on Wednesday 16th August 2006 at the American Club 131 Macquarie Street Level 15 Sydney at 6:30 pm.

The total attendance was 74, consisting of 12 Councillors, 30 members, and 32 guests.

Australia Address:

Chris R. Johnson, Executive Director, Cities & Centre Division, NSW Department of Planning delivered the Australia Address. Johnson was the jury for the East Darling Harbour International Design Competition; he spoke on how Sydney and its regional cities fit into the emerging global phenomenon of multi-centred cities and described the winning model which was on view.

Apologies:

A number of apologies were received and noted.

Confirmation of Minutes:

The minutes of the Forty-third Annual General Meeting held on Wednesday 24th August 2005 at Stamford Grand Hotel, Herring Road, North Ryde, Sydney, NSW having been circulated to members at the Meeting, were taken as read.

It was resolved that the minutes be confirmed as a true and correct record of the 43rd Annual General Meeting.

President's Report:

The President Ross Love, whose full report for 2005 was contained in the Annual Report, welcomed all present including guest speaker Chris Johnson and Club Auditor John Teer. He then outlined significant events in the year since the last Annual General Meeting as described in the Annual Report. In particular the President drew attention to the generosity of William D Ferris AO for funding the Non-profit Fellowships .

- the sixty-two new members since the last AGM,

The President paid tribute to John Turner who retired after having served on Council for 15 years as Editor of Club News, Treasurer and Secretary. In addition he compiled the first Members' Directory, prompted a review of Menzies Scholarship (done by Charles Irwin), joined with Mike Quinn at Harvard to confirm HBS professors for the first Leadership Program, assisted Clive Gard in a successful sponsorship of the programs, initiated the Australia-Harvard Fellowship and managed its two-year trial phase.

He concluded with thanks to the Executive and Councillors who had supported him in his final year as President.

The President drew members' attention to the Financial Statements for the year ended 31 December 2005 as audited by KPMG.

It was resolved that the Financial Statements for the Club for the year ended 31 December 2005 and the report of the Councillors and Auditors be approved and adopted.

HCA President's Report 2006-2007

Over the past year the Harvard Club of Australia has made considerable progress on the three broad focus areas that were identified as priorities by the Council after the 2006 AGM

To complete the work to establish the Harvard Club of Australia Foundation so that we have a clear direction for our philanthropy in future

To re-invigorate our commitment to our well established Menzies Scholarship

To re-invigorate social & educational opportunities for members and especially for younger members.

In this report I shall comment on each area.

The Harvard Club of Australia Foundation

The Council agreed to extend the HCA Foundation pilot program of bringing Harvard-based researchers to Australia, for another year and recently made four Australia-Harvard Fellowship awards.

Assoc Prof. Matthew W Gillman, MD, SM, Dept of Ambulatory Care & Prevention, Harvard Medical School, and Dept of Nutrition, Harvard School of Public Health. Dr Gillman will undertake collaborative research with University of Adelaide's Professor Julie Owens at its Research Centre for the Early Life Origins of Adult Disease and Maternal Perinatal Clinical Trials Unit.

Associate Professor Michael N Starnbach, PhD, Department of Microbiology and Molecular Genetics, Harvard Medical School. A specialist in ground-breaking immunology, Dr Starnbach will integrate ongoing researches at HMS and Queensland University of Technology aimed at designing vaccines against Chlamydia trachomatis in adolescent girls, in collaboration with Professor Peter Timms.

Professor Abraham Loeb, PhD, Professor of Astronomy, Harvard University, Harvard-Smithsonian Center for Astrophysics. Prof. Loeb, one of the world's most senior cosmologists, whose prime focus is the early cosmic epoch, will continue his collaboration with Dr J. Stuart Wyithe, ARC Queen Elizabeth Fellow at University of Melbourne's Physics Dept, in support of the Mileura Wide-Field Array (Low-Frequency Demonstrator) radio astronomy project under construction in Western Australia.

Professor Eric Mazur, PhD, Gordon McKay Professor of Physics and Applied Physics, Division of Engineering & Applied Sciences, Faculty of Arts & Science. Renowned for his innovations in physics education, which are cited as "truly revolutionary", Prof. Mazur will deliver a lecture series for national physics educators in collaboration with Dr Anna Wilson at ANU Research School of Physical Sciences & Engineering and Dept of Nuclear Physics. November 2007.

John Turner has continued to do an exemplary job in his role as Secretary of the Australia-Harvard Fellowship Program and is to be commended for his hard work on behalf of the club. In addition I would like to thank the selection panel, consisting of John as well as, Philip Hartog and John Tucker for giving their time to assess all of the applications and making recommendations to the Council and Trustees.

The progress of the Working Group to more formally establish the Harvard Club of Australia Foundation has been slower than anticipated, but the final steps for the establishment of a Constitution and the incorporation of the company as **HCA Foundation Limited** is nearly complete. The final form of the Foundation is proposed to be a company limited by guarantee and we plan to seek a listing in the Income Tax Assessment Act 1997 as a public charitable institution so that we are not limited in how we can disburse our funds. For example, this will permit us to fund individual scholarships to Harvard or to fund the cost of bringing Harvard faculty to Australia.

Annual Report

The Council decided to continue producing an economical abridged version of the Annual Report. Members wishing to view the full report may request a copy from the Administrator by email.

Menzies Scholarship

The 2007/2008 Menzies Scholarships was awarded to Rosie Dawkins [School of Public Health]. Monetary awards were also made to David Clarke [JFK School of Government] and Adam Palmer [Graduate School of Arts & Sciences].

I would like to thank Jennifer Blood, Alice Hill [HCAV] and Tony York for giving their time to assess all of the applications and represent the Club at this year's selection committee meeting in Canberra.

The Council, intends to review the Menzies scholarship program over the course of the year with an objective to determine how best to use the funds available, including the possibility of awarding multi year scholarships.

Non-Profit Fellowship

The national NPF program, generously funded by Bill and Lea Ferris, awarded two more fellowships this year. One was to David Beaver, Chief Executive, Centacare, Catholic Diocese of Ballarat and the other to Gerard Neesham, Chief Executive, Clontarf Foundation. Each fellow wins a place at Harvard's landmark course *Strategic Perspectives in Nonprofit* the annual strategy course for senior non-profit managers held at HBS. Fellowships were awarded to Beaver and Neesham at the annual Non-Profit Fellowship Lunch where the CEO of IAG Ltd, Mr Michael Hawker delivered the 2006 Leadership Address and the Ambassador of the United States to Australia, His Excellency, Robert D. McCallum Jr. presented the awards.

Once again, Ted Blamey served with extraordinary aplomb as the Chairman of the 2007 HCA NPF Committee and he was ably assisted on the selection committee by Council Vice President, Joanna White, Council Secretary, Tony Massaro and former Councillor Melinda Conrad. Bill Cowan and Mary Wooldridge continue to drive the HCA-Vic Fellowships. David Henderson, Queensland Chapter Convenor advised that they were unable to fund a fellowship in Queensland program this year. Ian Braslin, Western Australia's Chapter Convenor, is seeking funding for a WA fellowship.

Leadership Programs 2007

The 2007 Leadership Program was the 10th in the series and was held from Sunday 6 August to Friday 10 August 2007 at the Crowne Plaza Terrigal NSW. Harvard Business School Professors Lynn Paine & Rohit Deshpandé conducted the program entitled "Leadership and Corporate Accountability" to great acclaim from the 84 senior executives who attended.

This year, for the first time, the Club is very proud that it was able to offer a short residential Nonprofit Leadership Workshop for senior executives of qualifying nonprofit organisations from Friday 10 to Saturday 11 August 2007. Professors Paine & Deshpandé offered their services on a pro bono basis and the Workshop was sold out with 86 bookings.

Clive Gard did an outstanding job organising both of the Leadership Programs and was ably assisted by Anderson Knight our marketing and administrative partner, as well as by Club member, Philip Hartog who volunteered his time. Councillor Ted Blamey organised a highly successful "ice breaker" on Friday night for the Nonprofit Workshop.

Schools and Scholarships Committee

The Committee had a successful initial year conducting interviews for year twelve high school students who have applied to Harvard College. Future work for the Committee will include the establishment of Harvard Club Book Awards at local high schools. Club member Sarah Strasser has served with distinction as the inaugural Chairman of the Committee.

Thirtysix new Crimson Fellows, having been members for 25 years continuously, join our roll of honour and are listed on page 8.
